It is also certified that adequate clinical material as per the norms of the Central Council of Indian medicine is available with the proposed Medical College. It is further certified that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the **Ayurved** college as per the Central Council of Indian medicine norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the Central Government, the State Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the College with the permission of the Central Government.
