

- The University follows proper procedure for admissions as stipulated by the Academic Council and other statutory bodies of respective schools through the university's own entrance examination. Admissions to Law programme are made trough CLAT / LSAT scores, where as in the management discipline CAT/GMAT/C-MAT scores are considered.
