Part- IV- RECOMMENDATIONS

A. Observation of the committee:

- Management is highly committed to develop the University and has all finances resources to deliver.
- The faculties of the University were found satisfied with terms and conditions of their service with Mandsaur University and the ratio of the professor, associate professor and assistant professor is to be maintained.
- The students were found to be enthusiastic and positive about the Mandsaur University. No significant complaints were received from the students while interacting with them. Students were found highly satisfied with teaching learning processes and facilities provided.
- There is healthy gender mix among the students. However the female representations may be increased with some incentives/scholarships.
- The University has good Infrastructure and supportive administration and committed to growth of higher education in various disciplines.

B. Suggestions of the Committee which requires satisfactory compliance University:

- Sport and health facilities need to be upgraded in the campus.
- University should organize more Seminar/Conferences/ Workshops for research and academic development of the students and faculty members.
- It is suggested that there is a need for getting its programmes/activities accredited at the earliest by NAAC/NBA.
- Tree plantation, rain harvesting and STP plant facilities be made available.
- The University should increase the number of faculty with a Ph.D.

 A provision of additional increment be considered for the faculty having doctoral degree.

C. Final Recommendations

The committee after verifying the documents submitted and presented by the University, physically inspected the existing infrastructure, interacted with various stakeholders i.e. students, faculty members, staff and management, recommends unanimously for the grant of approval under section 2(f) of UGC Act 1956 to Mandsaur University, Mandsaur, MP.
