#### Part - IV - Recommendations

#### A. Observations of the Committee

Madhyanchal Professional University established in 2018 has satisfactory infrastructure facilities. However, there is scope for improvement. Since its establishment the university is facing problems in admission due to COVID. Still, nearly 2000 students are enrolled. The Committee has given a series of suggestions in Part I of the report which will help the University to improve the teaching-learning of University.

## B. Suggestions of the Committee which require satisfactory compliance by the University

- The committee suggests that the university may comply with the INC norms.
- Maintenance of campus and buildings need to be improved.
- For all courses, senior persons from core discipline may be appointed as Deans
- Buildings should be disabled friendly
- Faculty may be appointed as per the norms of UGC Regulations.

#### C. **Final Recommendations**

The expert committee after visiting various departments, interacting with stakeholders, going through the presentations made by the authorities and faculties of the university and the perusal of the documents is satisfied that the Madhyanchal Professional University, Ratibad, Bhopal is offering of programmes, availability of infrastructure, facilities, faculty members are largely as per the guidelines of UGC and other councils. However, the committee suggests that the Madhyanchal Professional University, may comply with the suggestions made by the committee as at B above.



Sir,

This has reference to your letter No.8-6/2018(CPP-I/PU) dated 18.03.2019 for nomination of the AICTE team on the UGC Expert Committee to visit Madhyanchal Professional University, Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh).

In compliance to the directions of the Education Ministry letter vide No. F-1-31/2006/TS-II dated 07.03.2007 and further clarification issued vide letters ref. no 1-31/2006-TS.II dated 26.5.2011 & an Office Memorandum no 1-31/2006-TS.II dated 9th May, 2013, the comments, observations and recommendations of the AICTE committee are hereby forwarded to incorporate in the UGC committee report to be placed before the Commission, so that appropriate decision in the matter may be taken before making recommendations to the Education Ministry.

Further, as per the visit report received on Madhyanchal Professional University, Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh), the Committee has made following observations:

1. Shortfall in faculty at the level of Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors

2. Inadequate Barrier Free Built Environment for disabled and elderly persons including availability of specially designed toilets for ladies and gents separately.

3. Post, Banking and ATM facilities are partially available.

4. No Group insurance to the employees, Insurance to the students and staff quarter facilities are available

5. LCD or Similar Projectors facility in the classrooms is partially available.

6. Need improvement in the following categories: -

- Budget allocation, utilization and financial practices Publicly available the detailed audited statements of all the receipts and expenditures
- (ii) Student admission : The number of seats filled
- (iii) Curriculum Relevance to Industries

(iv) Content delivery

(v) Method of Evaluation - External Involvement in examination

(vi) Professional activities

(vii) Innovation – Institutional support for entrepreneurship/innovation/IPR in terms of funding and infrastructure

(viii) Performance Appraisal

- (ix) Faculty Development Initiatives
- (x) Faculty Research Publications
- (xi) Faculty Intellectual Property Rights (IPR)
- (xii) Faculty R&D Consultancy Work & Testing

In view of the observations reported by the Visit Committee the aspect of shortfall at faculty level and cadre ratio needs to be strengthened on priority. However, AICTE is of the view that before granting approval to the **Madhyanchal Professional University, Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh), UGC** may please ensure the compliance of the deficiencies pointed out by the Visit Committee.
